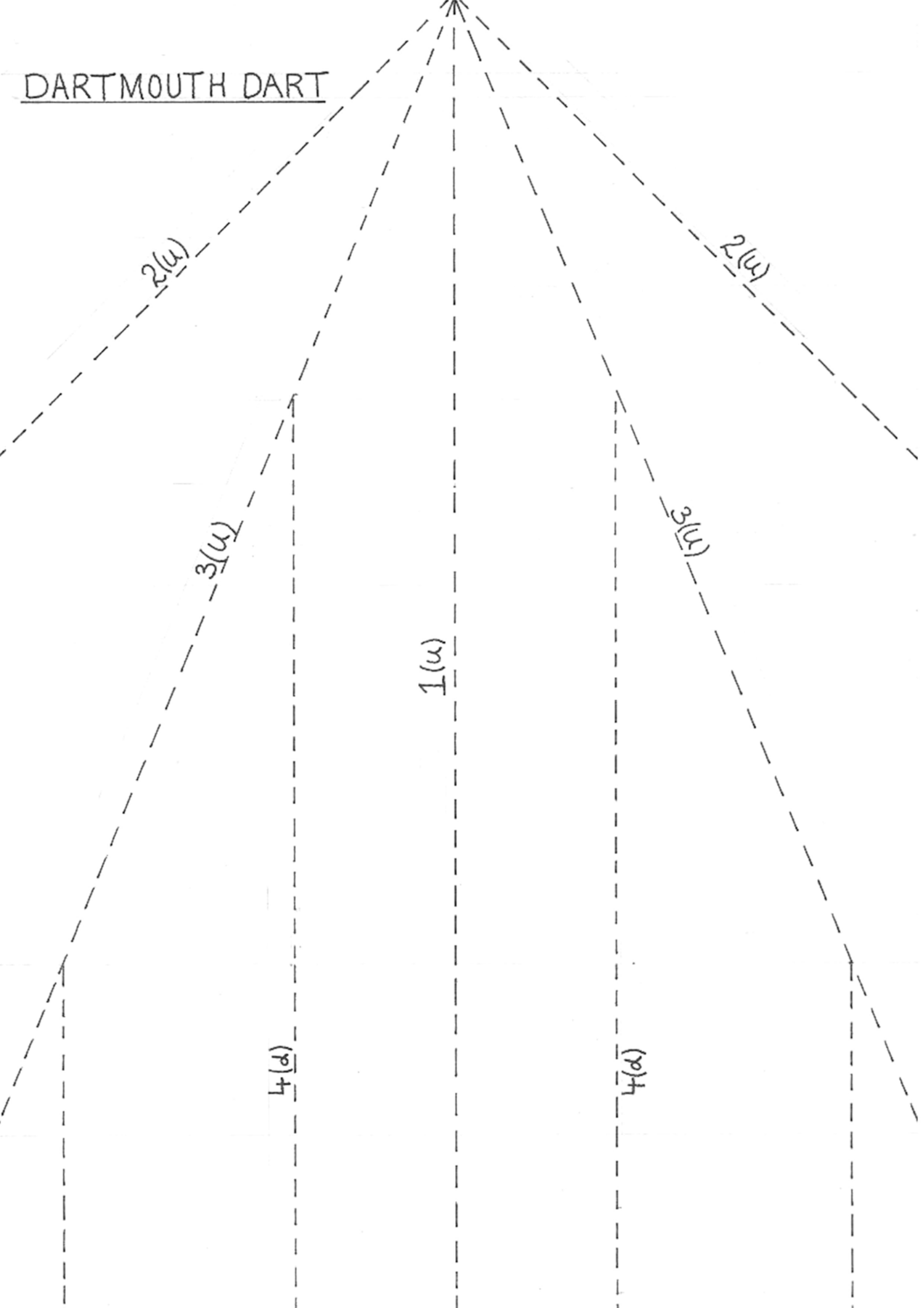


DARTMOUTH DART



1) The first stage of this plane is to fold a sheet of typing paper in half to make a sharp crease. The best paper to use is a white A4 sheet. This means the fold will be perfect. You can also draw a symmetrical design on the sheet if you wish.

2) The next stage is to open the piece of paper and turn the top corner (2u) until it meets the centre line. Then turn the other corner (2u) until it meets the centre line. Make sure that both creases meet the centre line.

3) Fold the lines (3u) so that the paper and the edges meet the centre line. We are now ready to fold the wings.

4) Fold the outer edge of the paper to make a wing, folding it to the centre line. Make a second fold to make the other wing. Keep the line of the wing parallel to tail and centre line.

Fold the outer tips of the wings to make stabizers. Fold them both in the same direction and make sure that they are equal so that they both work well. Staple or clip the fuselage about a third of the way down back from the nose to keep it together.

5) By now you should have finished your plane. You can if you wish colour in your plane with a design. I would advise not to use paint though as this may make the plane heavy or damage the wings to make it fly correctly.
